Dear Students and Families,

Welcome to my Arabic class ! I'm excited about the opportunity to get to know you, and I'm looking forward to a joyful and productive school year. The curriculum used is **Arabic at Your Hands العربية بين يديك AL-ARABIYYAH BAYNA YADAYK, Book 1 Part 1 for 6th Grade, Book 1 Part 2 for 7th Grade, and Book 2 Part 1 for 8th Grade.** The areas we will focus on include : Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing.

Syllabus :

Course objective: Arabic students will begin learning the basics of the Arabic language in 6th Grade. They will progressively acquire a working level of the language using sounds, vocabulary and grammar skills through listening,

speaking, reading, and writing. They will begin their understanding and proficiency of the target language and the culture of the Arabic-speaking world. Students then will be promoted to the next progressive level after they successfully pass all necessary requirements. Student-to-student interaction in Arabic will be encouraged during class. Students are encouraged and expected to communicate in Arabic whenever possible, to the best of their abilities, in pursuit of the goal of fluency through modeled dialogues and oral activities. Students will often be asked to present projects to class either individually or as a group. We will review grammar points, discuss texts, do “role plays” in class, and watch videos and powerpoints on Arabic culture time allowing.

Classroom Expectations:

Everyday Students Should:

Be Prepared- Please bring to class each day a pencil, pen (blue or black ink only),

textbook, composition book/notebook,

Free Read Book- if you have any short stories/books, ect... in Arabic I highly recommend that, however there will be some books available in class.

Entering Class- Students are expected to enter class quietly with all necessary materials and sit promptly in their assigned seat. As soon as you are seated, you will have work to begin working on.

While in Class- Students may leave their seat during class to throw things away, get a tissue, sharpen pencils, etc., provided I am not speaking. Students must raise their hand before speaking.

Exiting the Room- The teacher will dismiss students from class when their area is clean and all students are seated quietly. The bell is a reminder of dismissal for the teacher. The teacher will always dismiss the class.

For upcoming school events, parents are encouraged to check the school event calendar constantly. Please mark those dates on your calendar.
