Remember, what is said between you and I regarding the wellbeing of your child, will stay between us, unless other school personnel need to be informed.

Salat:

Alhumdulillah, Monday – Thursday we will be praying in the class. Please help reinforce the manners and actions for salat (prayer). Your continuous help is very much appreciated.

Regarding our little girls and dress code for salat. As we know, it is not mandatory for them to wear hejab, however if they would like to wear one it is perfectly fine. They may keep a hejab in their backpack. I suggest that you place it inside of a zip-lock bag before it goes in the backpack.

Lunch & Snack:

Alhamdulillah, here at ISI we strive for healthy foods. Candy bars, sugary drinks, etc. everyday is a no-no. Soda is not allowed. Carrot sticks, fruit, nuts, banana chips, pudding, and much more are better for our growing minds and bodies. Kindergarteners will have a mini snack break. Please provide snacks in your child's lunchbox.

Little Sweet notes for your child: you may wish to brighten their day with a lunchbox surprise! A note from Mama & Baba. It's a delight to see their faces light up when they find it!

Water Bottles:

Your child must bring a water bottle each class day. Please have their name written on it. Also, please make sure it is not a screw off cap as water may spill.

Outside Exploring Time:

Sun Safety: Sun cap, sunglasses, and sunblock are encouraged to wear when we go outside. I don't mind if they bring in a small toy for playground time. **(No play guns, swords, or other play fighting toys will be allowed.)**

Walking to our Neighborhood Library:

Once we feel we are ready to learn library skills, we'll be walking to our Irving library. Alhamdulillah, the library is next door to our school. I will be teaching them the manners of a library. Story time by Ms. Debbie is also an excellent learning experience. Permission slips will be sent out and kept on file.

Social and Emotional Learning is about helping students develop a range of skills they need for school and life. Social-Emotional skills include the ability to:

- set and achieve positive goals
- feel and show empathy for others
- establish and maintain positive relationships
- make responsible decisions
- understand and manage emotions

All of these skills are necessary to function well in the classroom, in the community, in college and careers. Not only are these skills vital for the above but also one's own personal life. It is my personal opinion that SEL should be taught as a core subject.

Classroom Toolbox

Learning the skills to be mindful of self helps a student to learn to focus more while in the time of need. Our class Tools for Learning are the following:

Breathing Tool: I calm myself & check-in by placing one hand on my heart and the other on my tummy. I take three deep breaths - inhaling & exhaling - with the last breath I hold and gently release saying Bismillah.

Quiet / Safe Place Tool: I remember where my quiet place is & use it when needed.

Empathy Tool: I care for **Myself** & I care for **Others**.

Personal Space Tool: I have the right to my own space & so do you.

Using Our Words Tool: I use my manners *kindness* when speaking about **Myself & Others**.

Please & Thank You Tool: I treat **Myself & Others** with kindness & appreciation.

Apology & Forgiveness Tool: I admit my mistakes & work to forgive **Myself & Others**.

Patience Tool: I am strong enough to wait.

Courage Tool: I have the courage to do the right thing.
